## Listening to a child read at home

After some experience with books, it is natural that children will want to try reading themselves. The chance to read with an adult they trust is a powerful learning experience for children. Children improve as readers when someone listens to them read at home. Some points that may help:

- ♣ The child should choose a book to read or might only read a part of it.
- Usually the book should be one the child can read easily with understanding. Highly successful reading allows children to practice what they have learned. It helps them to tackle the few unfamiliar words they meet with confidence.
- Listening to children and reading to them can happen anytime and anywhere. It doesn't have to be a special occasion, but it might be. It needs to be a regular, reliable time to listen.
- Be relaxed and encouraging.
- Don't worry if the reading is not word perfect.
- ↓ It helps if the child is reading a story you have read aloud first or that
  they have read it before. It is very difficult for beginning readers to read
  a story 'cold'. You might like to read part of it while the child follows the
  print as you read.
- ♣ You can talk about the cover, title, pictures, as well as the print.
- ♣ Children will often want to comment on the story or pictures. This shows that they are reading with understanding and pleasure. They are using words and pictures as clues to meaning.
- All learners make mistakes. If a mistake makes sense it shows a child is reading for meaning.
- Allow children time to pick up their own mistakes. This is one of the most important things they have to learn about being a reader.
- ♣ The most important part of the session is enjoying the book together.

#### Remember!!!

**BE POSITIVE.** Keep in mind how much progress has been made. Learning to read is hard work and encouragement helps.

**EXPECT SUCCESS** but be patient. Each child will learn, but at a rate and time right for him or her.

## **NAPLAN**

Next Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday are NAPLAN testing days for the years 3, 5 and 7 students. These are national tests that students across Australia in these year levels undertake. The tests are marked by national panels and the detailed responses to your child's attainment are provided late in term 3.

The tests start sharp at 9.10am each morning so please ensure your child is at school on time. If you have a child in another year level please be mindful of the testing that is underway.

We encourage all students to really persevere and give their best efforts. The test measures literacy and numeracy and how your child is performing in these areas at this early stage of the academic year. At years 5 and 7 they also measure the growth in learning for your child.

## **Dinosaur**

In Term 1 over weeks 8 and 9, Rooms 22, 23, 24, 26, 27, 28 and 29 went on



excursions to the South Australian Museum to visit The Dinosaur Evolution Exhibition. The exhibition consisted of fossils, dinosaur eggs, bones and detailed drawings. There were also three animatronic dinosaurs that the students enjoyed interacting with. They did roar and move, but luckily for us they didn't bite! We were also lucky enough to dig for fossils in the foyer, and we even had some time to explore the rest of the museum.

Visiting this exhibition supported our Science unit this term "Dinosaurs and More". Over the unit we have developed our understanding of living and non-living things, what living things need for survival and about their different habitats.
