The top four schools were involved in a tight tussle during the nine rounds. We fielded a relatively young team. Ten of our players were from Year 5 and 6. Ashton, a year 2 student, is our youngest player to represent Glenelg at state level. He had a great debut and he wasn't fazed by the more experienced competitors. Alex followed in his older brother's footsteps and gained a position in our state team. Both boys have been great ambassadors for Glenelg. We wish him well at High School next year.

Abdul Matin was the top player for Glenelg with 7 wins. He has won so many trophies and medals that he will need to add another shelf to his trophy cabinet! Evelyn completed a fabulous year. She won gold medals in both our Term 2 and 3 school tournaments, playing in the open division. She has now won the award for top female player in South Australia. As well as being an outstanding chess player, Evelyn coaches and mentors novice players. She has introduced many girls to chess. Our female participation rate is rising each year.

Rithic came third for our school and Zoe, Emilia and Ryan tied for fourth. Seven of our team were first time state players so the future looks good for chess at Glenelg.

Thank you to the parents who supplied transport. We always get great support from our principal, Rae Taggart, and many of the teachers on our staff who provide opportunities for our players to practise. A special thank you to Stephen Bice in room 16 for all of the extra coaching he does for our chess players.

At his farm he grows pink, white and yellow mushrooms. He brought some of the mushrooms into class. He told us to make sure you eat the right mushrooms because if you eat the wrong mushroom you might get infected. They showed us a picture of how mushrooms grow. After the mushrooms are big enough, they pop out and the little ones grow and do the same.

Tara and Michael brought in a microscope. Under it were nematodes and they looked really cool.

We looked at some of the mushrooms with the GO MICRO. A go micro a technological magnifying glass. This can be attached to an ipad or mobile phone. The images looked awesome.
