## Interoception

As a school, we are currently engaging in professional development in readiness to implement Interoception sessions into our learning environments regularly in 2021.

Interoception can broadly be defined as our conscious perception of our internal body signals which let us know how to respond to human needs or relate to our emotional experiences. Interoception is the pre-requisite for self-regulation. Interoception activities take less than 2-3 minutes to complete and they help your child to identify their body signals, recognise when their body signals change and act or respond to these body signals for their self-regulation. The great thing about interoception activities is that you can create your own with your child. It can be any activity that changes your child's body state and while encouraging them to notice how their body feels.

The data has indicated that the majority of students have acknowledged that they move from a 'not ready' to a 'ready' to learn mindset as a result of these short interoception sessions which are being conducted on a regular basis.
