From the Principal

Dear families and friends of Glenelg Primary School

The last few weeks have been both confronting and challenging for all members of our school community. I would like to thank all those who shared encouragement and well wishes, and thank you for acknowledging all the efforts of the staff and in some cases the sweet gifts to get staff through a difficult time. We also acknowledge that families would have been worried, especially with the range of false commentary that surfaced in the community. We have listened to your calls for greater, more timely communication to families and have shared these with the Department for Education to inform their improvement strategies when crafting communications for schools to deliver.

Education Department social workers were in attendance to support students with their concerns and teachers all reinforced protective behaviours with their children. This work is always ongoing. We have had Security and Incident Management staff conduct a site visit around the current arrangements. The Security and Emergency management team are actively working with the site to work through further improvements, which is ongoing. Static patrol guards are currently implemented which is currently being reviewed on a weekly basis. Other security options are currently being explored for more sustainable day and night measures.

Showcase of "my" learning is scheduled for Tuesday next week. This will provide an opportunity to come into the school and classrooms with your child(ren) showing you samples of their learning. This will also be an opportunity to visit other learning areas, including specialist areas, and gain some insight into what and where your children will be learning in the coming years. Please do not 'chat with a teacher' to provide this information – a written letter or e-mail is the only way we can accept information to consider. Information received after Friday 21st October is not able to be accepted, as the process will have moved onto the next stage by then.

Robert taught us some Kaurna language, told stories with the yidaki, and got everyone up and dancing some traditional Aboriginal dances.

Following on from the popularity of Book Week, the Canteen will now be selling Anzac cookies via QKR. The cookies are \$1.00 each and 100% delicious.




Also, the Canteen is now selling lactose free flavoured milk – Strawberry and Chocolate.
