Please Note - Nut Aware School



At Glenelg Primary School we have an increasing number children attending who suffer from severe anaphylactic reaction to nuts. These reactions can be serious and even life threatening. Many of these children need to have an Epipen on hand in case of emergencies at school. As caregivers we need to take all precautions necessary to minimise the risk of a life-threatening anaphylaxis. As a community we can work together to minimise risks with being exposed to these foods that trigger such attacks.

While we can never entirely enforce or regulate what comes from home in each child's lunchbox, we hope people will assist in working towards minimizing the risks and looking at sending alternatives from nut products to school in your child's lunchbox.

Energy Drinks at School

We have recently noted a rise in the number of senior students accessing high sugar and high caffeine drinks. Many of these drinks are readily available from local stores and vendors. A few students have become infatuated with the latest craze via social media of Prime Hydration and Prime Energy drinks (and similar variants) and have been bringing these products to school. Unfortunately these drinks contain significantly higher caffeine and sugars than Australian and International health recommendations.

Therefore we would like to engage with our school community to actively discourage their consumption and make sure students do not bring them to school. Also to make students aware that the sale of these products to classmates is prohibited. Many popular energy drinks and hydration drinks also recommend no more than 1 serve per day and not for children under 15.

Following published advice by medical professionals we are supporting not having these drinks either at school or before school, to support each child's physical and academic development.

We are aware that children are buying these drinks before and after school, while others are receiving them from family members who may be less aware of the negative impacts the drinks can have on development, behaviour, and cognitive performance at school.

We will speak to the students at the assembly tomorrow about this matter and remind our students that water is the best form of hydration and the only drink sanctioned for classroom consumption. We promote parents checking on their child's use/access to these drinks to best support their success at school.

Australian Media Literacies Summit

Our Creative Arts Specialist Teacher, Kelly Rivett, recently received a travel bursary to attend the first-ever Australian Media Literacies Summit in Sydney on Friday, 24th March. The summit explored the importance of media literacies and their educational benefits for students' future success. Media literacies are crucial in today's digital world, as they teach children to critically analyse and evaluate the information they receive



through various media sources. By attending this summit, Kelly gained valuable insights into teaching strategies that will help our students become media-literate, responsible, and informed citizens of the future.

But if you do want to provide a small item on your child's birthday, please keep in mind that the school and Governing Council believe that a maximum of **one small treat** for each child in the class is sufficient.

The main reasons for this are to keep in line with our health and safety guidelines and also to take away the "pressure" from parents to have to match the efforts of others.

Please discuss with your child's teacher in advance, in case there are certain dietary considerations needed.

Room Changes

As some of you may be aware, Room 4 was temporarily occupied by Mr Gale's Year 4 class for the majority of this Term due to his leg injury. Miss Patrice's Year 2 class was located in Room 16. Now that Mr Gale is able to manage going up the stairs again, his Year 4 class has now moved into Room 16 to join the other Year 4 classes upstairs and Miss Patrice has moved into Room 4 to join the Year 2 cohort downstairs.

These class changes will be reflected in the QKR App from the start of Term 2 onwards. Please ensure you update your child's class details in QKR in Term 2.

This 'change of room numbers' will be the case again once the Year 6 classes move into the new building later this year. We will advise families when this Year 6 move occurs.

Year 3—Surf Safety

On Thursday 30th March and Friday 31st March the Year 3 students participated in Surf Safety at Glenelg Beach. Students learnt about how to stay safe at the beach, how to rescue someone in trouble at the beach using life saving equipment, they learnt how to paddle board and played lots of games on the sand such as 'Flags'. The weather was sunny for most of the time and we were lucky enough to see some dolphins and a seal. Thank you to all of the parent volunteers who came along.











Year 4 Surf Safety

Recently this year students from Glenelg Primary School went to Glenelg Beach. We were learning about the importance of water safety.

At surf safety students learnt about sea creatures, rips, and signs. Keep a look out for these dangerous sea creatures: stingrays, jellyfish, sharks, sea urchins, lionfish, blue ringed octopuses, beaked sea snakes, marbled cone snails, striped pyjama squids and blue bottle noses.

If you think you see a rip and are not sure if it is one be sure to tell an adult ASAP. These are clues to tell what a rip is: deeper and darker water, fewer breaking waves, significant water movement, sandy coloured water extending beyond the swim zone and debris or seaweed gathering.

The students who went to Glenelg beach had an excellent learning opportunity.





Our Program

The Happy Haven OSHC Vacation Care program provides a warm, caring, fun, stimulating and interesting environment, full of exciting activities and excursions for your children to enjoy during their school holidays. Please ensure you read all the information provided on the program & the consent forms to help you and your children have a trouble free, fun, and successful holiday.

Please contact us for any further information. Extra copies of the program are available online.

Notification of cancellations for any vacation care days, must be made two weeks prior to the day that has been booked. Cancellations after this date will incur a full fee. This amount will be less your CCS and recorded as an absent day. Note: Children are approved up to 42 absence days per financial year, once used full fees will apply.

Opening Hours

We are open 7:00am-6:00pm. We implement a late pickup fee policy, which is \$25.00 per family for the first 15mins late and \$60.00 thereafter. Please phone and let us know if you are going to be late.

Fees

1. \$68.50 per child per day

- 2. Childcare Subsidy (CCS) is income and means tested, please contact Family Assistance Office (FAO) on Ph: 136 150 to be assessed.
- Payment of fees is by Direct Debit and this is processed a week in arrears.

General Information

- Please encourage your child to read and prepare for Vacation Care days so they are well prepared for the activities.
- Please send your child with a packed recess, lunch & water bottle. Children are usually very active during the holidays and may also require extra fuel to keep them going. Please do not send your children with lunches that need to be heated or cooked, we cannot heat or cook any food due to WH&S restrictions.
- Please label all personal items so that they can be easily identified.
- We will provide breakfast (before 8:00am) and fruit and vegetable platters daily (this is not a substitute to lunch). If an alternate snack is provided, it will be listed at the service dally.
- "Please note that all programmed activities are aligned with the National Quality Standards, My Time Our Place Framework and Early Years Learning Framework to provide a holistic

Vacation Care Information

- Excursion times are approximate please ensure all children are at OSHC by the scheduled departure time or risk missing the excursion. Buses cannot wait for children who arrive after the time listed.
- Children are not permitted spending money for excursions. Exceptions will be listed on program.
- · Please send a hat, suitable clothes (SunSmart) and shoes (sneakers), lunch and water bottle for all excursions. Thongs, sandals etc. are not recommended for play. If a child arrives without a hat on an excursion day, one will be charged to your account, and your child will be provided a hat with their name written in it to keep for future excursions.
- · For many of our excursions, we join together with children from other Happy Haven run sites.
- We adhere to educator: child ratios, as determined by an individual risk assessment conducted for each excursion. These are available on the site iPad, in the parent area.
