Premier's Be Active Challenge

This year, we had 347 students complete their Premier's Be Active Challenge, achieving 60 mins of physical activity five days a week for at least four weeks. Glenelg PS also achieved

the top 50 schools in South Australia for the large number of 10-week challenge participants, rewarding us with \$1000 to put towards new equipment for students.

On Tuesday 21st November our Sports Captains and Senior Student Leaders represented GPS at the presentation ceremony with the Minister for Education, Blair Boyer MP. The student leaders participated in come and try sports events with some of SA's best sports teams including soccer, rugby union and circus skills, along with students from others schools across South Australia. Sonny and Sienna accepted the award from the Minister in the official presentation ceremony.

All GPS students were presented with their medals at the Week 6 assembly. Special presentations were made to the Champion (4th year), Legend (5th year), Hall of Fame (6th year), Be Active for Life Bronze (7th year) and Be Active for Life Silver (8th year) achievements.

We look forward to increasing the number of students completing the challenge in 2024.




Thank You Alan!


