From Leadership

At Glenelg Primary School, we are committed to giving our students the best opportunities to learn and grow, especially when it comes to reading. As a staff, we are focussing on the Science of Reading and have been making changes to the way we teach spelling and phonics. This work is in line with the Department for Education's advice on the 'Phonics and Spelling Scope and Sequence' as well as evidence-based 'Explicit and Systematic Phonics Instruction'.

Learning to read is an essential skill for success in school, to function in society, and to experience the joy that reading brings. Phonics instruction teaches the relationship between letters and sounds. We focus on students learning the skills to 'crack the code' of the alphabet and the speech sounds of English. To crack the code, children must first learn to identify, decode, and blend the sounds in words before they can understand the meaning of the text. Our phonics teaching follows a sequence from simple to complex sounds.

Whilst much of this work happens at school, you can support your child in learning to read by assisting them with the following things when they read:

- Track your finger under the word and say each sound that the letter or letter string represents, blending the sounds as you go. /l//jah//t/ /b//oa//t/.
- Once your child has blended the sounds together and says the word, prompt them to read it again fluently. If they cannot blend the word, tell them the whole word.
- Echo read say small phrases and sentences and the child echoes back.
- Choral read read together at the same time.

NAPLAN testing

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) gives a snapshot of how students across Australia are learning and provides schools and the government with information that can assist with strategic directions. It also provides families with another source of information about how students are performing in Literacy and Numeracy on the day of testing.

Students in Years 3 and 5 at GPS will participate in the NAPLAN tests in Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy. Year 3 students will complete the writing test on paper.

NAPLAN is not a test that can be studied for and students are not expected to do so. You can reassure your child that NAPLAN is just one part of their school program and remind them on the day to simply do their best.

Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests, how to use the online platform and provide appropriate support and guidance.

Governing Council Report

Our Governing Council met for the first meeting of 2024 on the 12th of February at 6.30pm. The Council meet a minimum of two meetings per term to consider local issues, allocation of resources and strategic matters for the school. The Council were provided a very detailed report from the school leadership on issues for noting, discussion or decisions, including; staffing for this year, building works, completion of the upgrades to COLA, installation of the new fence, the school improvement plan which has looked at writing and the teaching of functional grammar, key focus areas for wellbeing, information technology use in the school, enrolments for 2024, and the uniform policy. A finance update was provided by the Treasurer. The Council also has several subcommittees that undertake work and bring items of attention to the Council for consideration.

- Canteen committee items included financial position of the canteen, use of departments school's mark-up tool, depreciation of equipment and engagement of staff/volunteers.
- OSCHC committee will meet in Week 5, however discussion regarding the critical incident at the end of 2023 and confirmation of representation from Governing Council to the committee took place.
- Parents and Friends committee updated us on activities that they are considering holding in 2024, with further information to come after their next meeting.
- After hours sport committee is yet to convene for 2024 but an update was provided on registrations for this year and the necessity to find coaches and helpers.

The Council also approved the proposed dates for the school closure dates for 2024. Our next meeting is the Annual General Meeting on 18 March 2024. This is your opportunity to come along to meet your Governing Council members, or if you are interested in being a parent representative on the Council, please register your interest via a nomination form (available from Friday 1st March) at the Front Office. Nomination forms need to be completed and submitted according to the instructions on the form.

Year 5 Surf Education

During Weeks 4-6, students across Years 3-5 will be participating in the Surf Education program at Glenelg Beach. This program focuses on water safety, including building confidence in the water, swimming and board techniques, how to survive in the water and rescue others, exploration of water safety services, endurance and fitness activities.

Last week, students across Year 5 had the first opportunity to take part in the program for 2024. Thursday put on spectacular beach weather for the group and warm conditions meant that most students tried their hand at most of the water activities that were on offer. While Friday's conditions were certainly much cooler, students managed some water time, but sand and jetty activities were generally preferred.

For many students, getting on a board in the sea was a new experience for them, while for others, it was about refining a skill that they had practised many times before. No matter the skill level, it was great to see all students getting involved, learning new things and having fun!

We would like to thank the Glenelg Surf Life Saving Club and their instructors for facilitating the Surf Education program again for us this year. We would also like to sincerely thank our volunteers who escorted us to and from the beach on both days. Your support enables us to offer these experiences for our young people and for that, we are very appreciative.

The Commissioner's Digital Challenge

Each year since 2022, Glenelg PS has taken part in the Commissioner for Children and Young People's Digital Challenges. It is a free curriculum-aligned online resource for schools to help Educators teach children and young people computational, design and systems thinking skills.
