Assemblies in 2024

In Term 1 we have trialled assemblies in Lesson six of alternate Fridays (even weeks). We recognise that mornings are the optimal time for class time and student learning, so we trialled moving assemblies away from mornings. But various timetables and schedules meant that Friday afternoons was our only option. One difficulty this has presented is that our amazing Performing Arts teacher, Jo Brus, doesn't work on Fridays, which means our choirs and other performers don't get the opportunities to present to the whole school. So we are trying a hybrid model for assemblies for the rest of 2024. Assemblies towards the start of the term will be at 2:25pm on Fridays. Assemblies towards the end of the term will be on Thursdays at 9am. In Term One, this means that the assemblies in Weeks 2, 4 and 6 will be (have been) Friday assemblies, while the Weeks 8 and 10 assemblies (21st March and 4th April) will be (have been) on Thursday mornings. We will do our best to keep families informed of assembly times ahead of time via the school newsletter.

Governing Council Update

On 18th March 2024 the Annual General Meeting (AGM) was held which gave an opportunity for those present to hear from the School Leadership in their Annual Report. The highlights included hearing more about the improvements journey for 2023/2024, seeing some samples of functional grammar activities and being provided some information around the Year 3-6 spelling and morphology. We also heard about wellbeing initiatives, intervention and support and received an update on 2024 enrolments and IT upgrades.

Once the AGM had concluded, it was time to form the new Governing Council for 2024. All new nominees shared a brief personal profile to all attendees and then were welcomed into the Governing Council for 2024.

There may be reduced car parking in the council car park off of Brighton Road due to team bus requirements and associated personnel etc. **Glenelg Football Club will be erecting temporary fencing and toilets in the Williams Ave school entrance area around 7:30-8am tomorrow morning (Thursday 28th March).** They are hoping to get this done quickly to avoid congestion with school drop off times. The temporary fence will only block off part of the walk way so we will still have sufficient room to pass through.

Be Active Challenge

As in previous years, in 2024 students can participate in the Premier's Be Active Challenge. The Premier's Be Active Challenge sets physical activity goals for students to achieve and rewards them with a medallion for their efforts.

The challenge is to do at least 60 minutes of physical activity on at least 5 days of the week for at least 10 consecutive weeks

Some year levels may be completing the activity record in class to support other academic concepts and cross-curricular learning. Physical activity can include active games at recess and lunch breaks, PE lessons, class games, swimming lessons, and any sporting clinics or activities they do at school and at home. A list of physical activities that count towards the challenge is attached.

You can also support our school to be eligible for a \$1000 sports equipment grant by completing the challenge. Only the top 50 schools in the state are eligible, so the more students that complete this challenge, the higher our chance of receiving the grant.

Once you have completed your challenge, return your Activity Book to Miss Arnold. These need to be completed and returned by the end of Term 3.

These values are found throughout our school and within the Glenelg Primary philosophy.

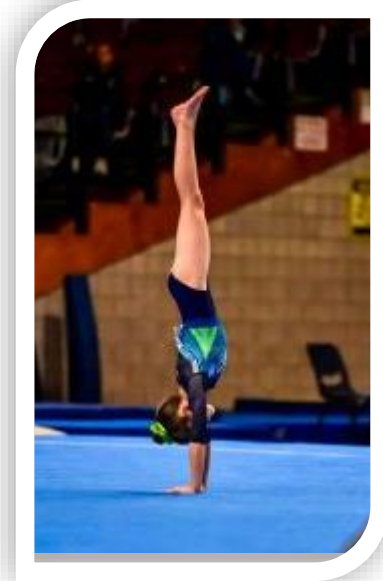
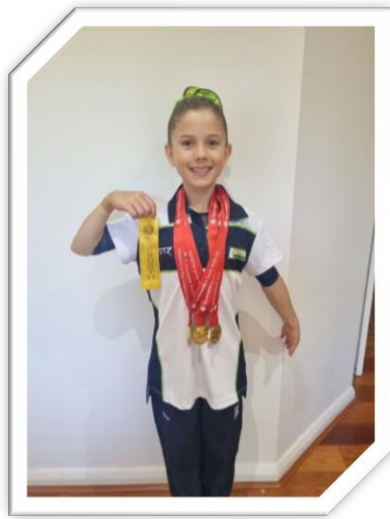
Gymnastic Superstar



“Hi All, we have an exciting change to our sign in/out process. All parents/caregivers will be required to sign your child/ren in and out of OSHC on OWNA through a kiosk on the iPad. The iPad will be stationed in the regular position on the bench inside the OSHC room. The kiosk will allow access to sign in and out of each session, sign incident reports, view the service's QIP (Quality Improvement Plan) and view the weekly programs.

Each existing parent/caregiver has a unique pin number. This number will be entered into the iPad when collecting your child/ren. Your pin can be reset in settings on your app. We have a folder at the service for educators to help you find your existing pin number.
